## The Power of the Mid-Year Pivot

Man, I can't believe it's June already - where has the year gone? I'm looking forward to the warm weather that is coming.

*"But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal to win the prize for which God has called me heavenward in Christ Jesus"*  
Philippians 3:13-14



We've officially crossed the bridge into the second half of the year. For many of us, January feels like a lifetime ago. Maybe you started the year with high hopes that have since been sidelined by "real life" or perhaps you've been running so hard that you haven't paused to see where you're going. The good news? Our God is the author of new beginnings. You don't need a New Year's Day to start fresh; you only need a moment of surrender.

### 1. Acknowledge "The Big Lesson"

Look back at the last six months, what has been the recurring theme? Often, God uses our busiest seasons to teach us one specific thing—perhaps it's trust, patience, or the beauty of silence. Don't let the first half of the year pass without "banking" the wisdom God gave you in the struggle.

### 2. Practice the Holy Pivot

In the verse above, Paul talks about *"forgetting what is behind."* This doesn't mean ignoring our history; it means refusing to be paralyzed by past mistakes or missed goals. If you fell off your Bible reading plan, or let a habit slip, today is your pivot point. Grace covers the gap between where you wanted to be and where you are right now.

### 3. Set Your End-of-Year Vision

Imagine sitting down on December 31st. How do you

want to feel about your walk with God? Instead of a long list of "to-dos," pick one spiritual rhythm to focus on for the next six months. Whether it's five minutes of morning prayer or a weekly act of service, small steps of faithfulness lead to a life-changing destination.

### A Mid-Year Prayer:

*Lord, thank You for bringing me through the first half of this year. I surrender my disappointments and my distractions to You. Refresh my spirit, clear my vision, and help me to press on toward the goals You have for my life. Let the next six months be defined by Your grace. Amen.*

On Sunday June 14, we will be having a carry-in after Worship. Everyone is welcome.

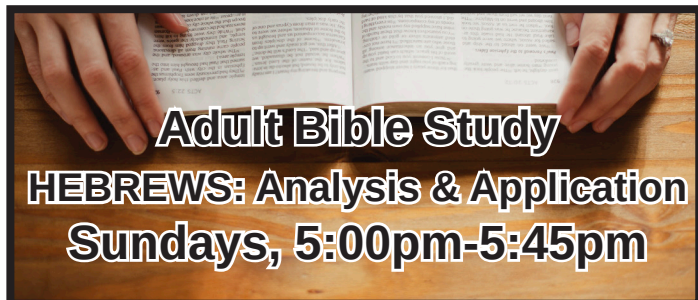

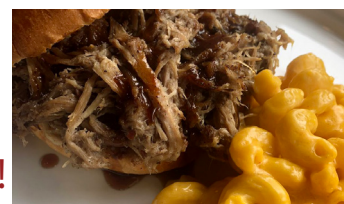



## **Father's Day**

When I consider the month of June, one holiday that stands out to me is Father's Day. This year Father's Day is also the first day of summer! We are planning an outdoor worship service for that day as well.

I believe that godly men make the best fathers. In Proverbs 23:24 we read: *"The father of a righteous man has great joy; he who has a wise son delights in him."* Godly men and their sons stand out as positive role models in their homes and in their communities.

Today our communities need more men of conviction who believe in right and wrong. Men who will not compromise their Christian testimonies, nor sacrifice Biblical principles upon the altar of what seems to be most convenient for them at any given moment. We need men who practice justice and seek after the truth. We need men who value honesty 365 days each year.

We also need more men of compassion. It takes real strength of character for a man to be kind and unselfish. Men able to empathize with others who are hurting and develop tender hearts are essential. We need men who can balance moral absolutes with human dignity.

We also need more open-minded men who realize that they do not know the final word on everything. Open-minded men are willing to consider the possibility that there may be many spiritual truths they have not yet discovered and applied to their lives. It takes a mature man to openly admit that he has been mistaken about an issue.

Finally, we need more men who openly show and verbally express their love to their families. The family is a very profound and yet fragile social institution in 2026. We need men who will willingly help their wives and their children to grow emotionally and spiritually. We need men to be faithful to their marriage vows. Children need to sense that their father has an unconditional love for their mother. In-laws need to feel that their sons-in-laws are genuinely concerned about their well-being.

If a professional poll were taken in our communities today, how many godly fathers would be found whose lives are characterized by conviction, compassion, open-mindedness, and love for each and every member of their extended families?

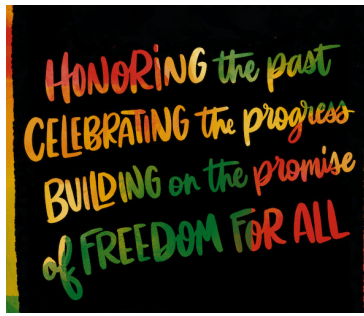

The Gospel calls believers to value the God-given dignity and freedom of every person, to mourn injustice, and to celebrate truth, liberation, reconciliation, and the ongoing work of loving our neighbors as Christ loves us.

## Everence Update

Everence offers many grants and awards. I am listing some of them below:

- **Will preparation grants** – Everence members can receive partial reimbursement for the cost of preparing their will or other end-of-life/legacy plan. Available every five years - 50% of the cost, up to \$50 per household
- **College Scholarships** – 45 per year - ranging from \$1,000 to \$3,000
- **Sharing Fund grants** – Congregational advocates can obtain up to \$3,000 per year in matching grants for helping people, supporting charity efforts, etc.
- **Church Loans** - Loans made to churches and related agencies funded, in part, through Everence annuities or mission-driven securities.
- **Chapter grants** - We also provide funds for regional Everence chapters to help a variety of projects and programs, like housing projects and homeless shelters; community playgrounds and low-income daycares; medical clinics and blood drives; food pantries; community disaster relief; and more.
- **Accidental Death benefit** - As a member of Everence Association, Inc. (Everence®), you are eligible for \$1,000 of Accidental Death benefit. THERE IS NO COST TO YOU. This benefit is only available to those members who have applied for, received membership, and, at the time of becoming a member, reside in a state where Everence Association, Inc. is licensed. This benefit ends on your 70th birthday.
- **Safe Church grants** - Everence supports churches in protecting children, teens and vulnerable individuals with its Safe Church Grant. Churches with an Everence Stewardship Advocate may request a Safe Church Grant. Specific guidelines apply.
- **Journey awards** - Do you know someone who is a role model when it comes to being a responsible steward of his or her gifts and resources – including time, talent, money, health and the earth? Then nominate them for an annual Everence Journey Award!

Journey Award recipients receive a combination award gift:

1. A donation to a nonprofit organization of their choice – \$5,000 for national award recipients and \$1,000 for regional.
2. A "blessing cup" – symbolizing how Journey Award recipients are like vessels that hold and nurture resources for God's work during their stewardship journeys.

“This is the inspiring true story behind MercyMe’s beloved hit song. Running from a troubled home life and a broken relationship, Bart Millard found escape in music. Hitting the road in a decrepit tour bus, Bart and his band MercyMe set out on an amazing journey none of them could ever have imagined, in this uplifting, music-filled movie that beautifully illustrates the power of forgiveness and God’s love.” I chose to bring this video to your attention because I have heard that there is *I Can Only Imagine 2* out now.
