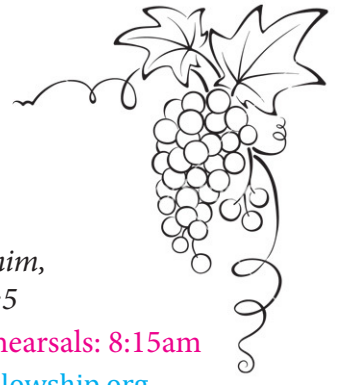

Green Growth of May

May might be one of my favorite months and not because it's my birthday month, but, as a lot of you know, I was born on Memorial Day. So I have told my parents that I get the whole weekend to celebrate my birthday (LOL).

I look forward to planting flowers and seeing the green grass and just enjoying the newness of everything.

But going back to Green Growth of May: Tending the Garden of the Soul. If April is the month of unpredictable showers, May is the month of the "Great Unfolding." Everywhere we look, the world is trading its dusty browns for vibrant electric greens. In the garden, the seeds we buried weeks ago are finally breaking through the soil, proving that life was working beneath the surface even when we couldn't see it. The Beauty of the Breakout

If you feel a bit of "growing pains" this month—perhaps a new challenge at work, a call to be more patient with family, or a push to deepen your prayer life—remember that the tension is a sign of life. You aren't breaking; you are blooming.

Tending Your Inner Garden

A garden left to itself will grow, but a garden tended will

flourish. This May, consider these three ways to nurture your "new growth":

1. Clear the Weeds: What distractions are choking out your peace? Sometimes growth isn't about adding more to our schedules, but clearing out the "weeds" of worry or comparison.

2. Soak in the Light: Just as plants turn toward the sun (phototropism), we thrive when we turn toward what is good, true, and beautiful. Make time for daily reflection or a quiet walk to "recharge your batteries."

3. Celebrate the Small Sprouts: You don't need to be a giant oak tree by May 31st. Celebrate the small victories—a kind word spoken, a moment of gratitude, or a difficult task finally started.

A Season of Promise

May reminds us that nothing stays buried forever. The "long winters" of our lives eventually give way to spring. As you watch the world turn green this month, take a moment to breathe in the fresh air and thank God for the new beginnings He is planting in you.

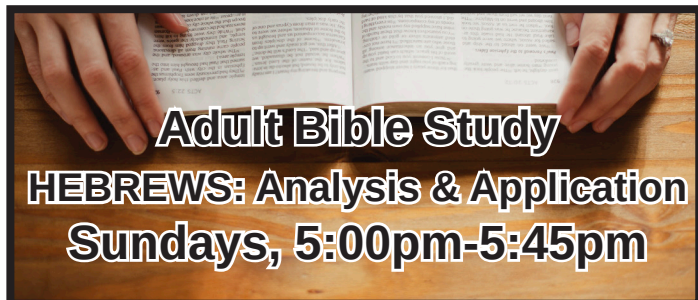
The best is yet to come.



Pentecost

Acts 2:1 informs us that When the day of Pentecost came, they were all together in one place. On May 24, 2026, Christians around the world will again have the privilege of celebrating a special birthday. They will be celebrating the birthday of the church of Jesus Christ in the city of Jerusalem that occurred during the year AD 30. It is my desire that each of you will be found with one accord in one place on Pentecost Sunday for Biblical instruction, praise, thanksgiving, singing, and worship. Pentecost Sunday is also a time for us to reflect on the work the Lord Jesus Christ has for each one of us as a part of His body on this planet in our local congregation.

According to The Brethren Encyclopedia Pentecost eventually became a Christian observance for the seventh Sunday following Easter. The early Annual Meetings of the Brethren were nearly always scheduled around Pentecost Sunday. During the early recorded conferences, Pentecost Sunday was set aside for worship and a love feast. Business meetings were not a part of activities on Pentecost Sunday. In fact the Church of the Brethren usually continued to hold its Annual Conferences at Pentecost until 1917! Today, the Old German Baptist Brethren usually continue to follow the practice of meeting at Pentecost for their conferences.

Pentecost Sunday 2026 again will be a time for all Christians to recognize the potential of the ministry of the Holy Spirit in the life of individual believers and in the life of the local congregation. On the first Pentecost Sunday the Apostle Peter preached a Holy Spirit empowered message. On that same day according to Acts 2:41 "Those who accepted his message were baptized, and about three thousand were added to their number that day."

Let us never forget the special power available to each child of the one and only true and living God. As Christ said in Acts 1:8 But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses. At Pentecost, after just 120 believers prayed in an upper room, they found their lives were changed forever as they were filled and empowered by the Holy Spirit. Not only were their lives changed, but 3,000 believers in Christ were added to that congregation in just one day! May each of us anew appreciate the gift of the Holy Spirit given to God's children on Pentecost and be ever

more faithful witnesses to the power of the Good News of the Lord Jesus Christ found and declared in the Holy Bible.

Distressed, Dr. Chibanda tested ways to make treatment more accessible. "Friendship Bench" was born, a program where therapists sit on discreetly placed benches, ready to counsel people with needs. And who did he train as therapists? Grandmothers! In an interview, Dr. Chibanda shared "[Grandmothers] are rooted in their communities ... they have an amazing ability to ... make people feel respected and understood."

Just as Dr Chibanda saw the influence and compassion of grandmothers to make a difference in mental healthcare in Zimbabwe, may God open our eyes to see the strengths of each person. God has gifted each of us with unique experiences, resources, and talents (Roman's 12:6). Let's allow him to use us in building up the church and serving our community.
