

Unity & Protection

“My prayer is not for the world, but for those you have given me, because they belong to you. All who are mine belong to you, and you have given them to me, so they bring me glory. Now I am departing from the world; they are staying in this world, but I am coming to you. Holy Father, you have given me your name; now protect them by the power of your name so that they will be united just as we are. During my time here, I protected them by the power of the name you gave me. I guarded them so that not one was lost, except the one headed for destruction, as the Scriptures foretold.

“Now I am coming to you. I told them many things while I was with them in this world so they would be filled with my joy. I have given them your word. And the world hates them because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. I’m not asking you to take them out of the world, but to keep them safe from the evil one. They do not belong to this world any more than I do. Make them holy by your truth; teach them your word, which is truth. Just as you sent me into the world, I am sending them into the world. And I give myself as a holy sacrifice for them so they can be made holy by your truth.”
-John 17: 9-19

This passage in John is a large part of Jesus Christ's prayer in the garden of Gethsemane before He is about to be betrayed and sentenced to death. The whole of this chapter is insightful and powerful, but in this section, Jesus is specifically praying for the disciples who had walked with Him in His time, the ones whom would be responsible for the immediate spread of the news of Christ after He was gone. Interestingly, they get the longest piece of text in the prayer. Let's take a look at these words together:

There's a brief and beautiful note in there that **Jesus wants us to be filled with His joy**. This is a testament to God's nature that shouldn't be overlooked. He knew we would be bound for 'hate', for opposition from others who cannot (or refuse to) understand. He knew we would find rejection, woe, sacrifice, and condemnation just as He had and would suffer. This small statement saying that the purpose of His teaching was so they would find *joy* in the living - in the fulfilling of that teaching - is a positive reflection of God's love.

Jesus also knew these specific followers would now be the critical instruments for all of Christianity to come.

Christ is quite aware He has been the glue holding this unlikely bunch together. Now that His time has come to return to the Father, **they will need unity**. Which makes a lot of sense; His closest twelve alone were made up of tax collectors, fishermen, sinners, blood-thirsty zealots, and the like. It was surely a difficult existence. There must have been arguments, jealousies and in-fighting along the way, but the disciples were held together by the power of their charismatic and determined leader. They may not have always understood what His message was and their faith may have wavered at times, but all of them, apart from the tragic case of Judas, stuck with Him until His death. So Jesus prays for them to receive the kind of unshakable unity that He has with the Father.

He also prays for **protection from evil** so they can **engage in the world**. So they can *engage* in the world - not so they can hide from it, not so they can be controversial and confrontational to it, but so they may *engage*. This means engaging in love, peace, patience, healing, and miracles, but also teaching, guiding, and witness. This does not mean accepting culture as it is, but rather serving in it while resisting the urge to succumb to it. The world was going to lash out at them and they would be operating in extreme peril - but He was sending them to endure no less than *He* was sent to endure. They needed to persevere with God's great and mighty hedge of protection.

After praying for His immediate disciples, Christ turns His focus to you and me, the entire group of future followers He knows are destined to come:



“I am praying not only for these disciples but also for all who will ever believe in me through their message. I pray that they will all be one, just as you and I are one—as you are in me, Father, and I am in you. And may they be in us so that the world will believe you sent me.

“I have given them the glory you gave me, so they may be one as we are one. I am in them and you are in me. May they experience such perfect unity that the world will know that you sent me and that you love them as much as you love me. Father, I want these whom you have given me to be with me where I am. Then they can see all the glory you gave me because you loved me even before the world began!”
-John 17:20-24

Christ repeats - emphasizes - **our need for unity**. And not just with each other, but with God the Father, Jesus his

Son, and eventually, the Holy Spirit. We should all be so unified with Christ as individuals and institutions that we are therefore united totally together by our one central focus. By this kind of unity, the world will know Jesus Christ and His love.

Do you know which section of Jesus' prayer was the shortest? The one about Himself (verses 1-5). And His personal prayer was one of surrender and acceptance, an acknowledgement of His fate and request for glory only so that He could give it right back to the Father.

How much stronger would we *all* be if these were our prayers? As an individual, a family, as a church, as a nation? We should be in fervent prayer for inexplicable unity, prayers to remove the enemy's lies, to eradicate the distractions of the things that divide us and instead put into us a holy focus on the One who makes us the same. We need prayers for the world to see that in a society where everything is divisive, Christ-followers are *different*. We should pray the world hates what we do because we are *so full of love* it doesn't have the control over us that it wants.

We should be praying for that protection, for the devil to flee before us as we go out and tell our story. Pray for armor against the discouragement, embarrassment, and attack. With God's protection He will bring the courage and reassurance to help us have the strength to engage. Jesus knew we could not go on wisdom and knowledge alone, but that we would need the love, unity, protection, and holiness that comes only from the One above.

Lord, make us holy by Your truth - Amen!

Story Behind the Worship Song...

We are continuing to share the stories behind some of the most popular hymns and worship songs we often sing on Sunday mornings. As we begin the month of July celebrating our nation's freedom and independence, let's take a look at a hymn of peace and unity that focuses beyond our borders...

“This is My Song” – Lloyd Stone and Georgia Harkness
(by Dr. Hawn of Discipleship Ministries and Pastor Teri Ditslear of The Times)

Lloyd Stone (1912–1993) was born in Coalinga, California. He attended the University of Southern California where he majored in music. He wrote the poem “*This is My Song*” around the time of his graduation from USC in 1933. In 1934, the words were put to the tune of Finlandia (“*Be Still My Soul*”).

Georgia Elma Harkness (1891–1974) was born in Harkness, New York – a town named after her grandfather. She became a high school teacher after graduating from Cornell University. She later completed her master's degree in both religious education and philosophy through Boston University. Harkness became a well-known American Methodist theologian and philosopher. She was the first ordained minister of the Methodist Church. Sometime between 1937–1939

Harkness wrote two additional stanzas to Lloyd Stone's “*This is My Song*” at a request to make it more “distinctly religious”. The last stanza ties to the Lord's Prayer and ends with personal dedication. The song has since been published in 26 hymnals.

This hymn represents how many of us feel about our country, our love and respect for her, while also acknowledging the love of country around the world for other peoples. As we approach Independence Day in America, let's praise God for the freedom we enjoy in this country, for opportunities to flourish, and for the security of our land. May we be more aware of just how blessed we are as a nation, more grateful for our blessings, and more eager to share them with others.



*This is my song,
O God of all the nations,
A song of peace for lands afar and mine.
This is my home, the country where my heart is;
Here are my hopes, my dreams, my holy shrine.
But other hearts in other lands are beating;
With hopes and dreams as true and high as mine.*

*My country's skies are bluer than the ocean,
And sunlight beams on clover-leaf and pine.
But other lands have sunlight too and clover,
And skies are everywhere as blue as mine.
Oh, hear my song, O God of all the nations,
A song of peace for their land and for mine.*

*May truth and freedom come to every nation;
May peace abound where strife has raged so long;
That each may seek to love and build together,
A world united, righting every wrong;
A world united in its love for freedom,
Proclaiming peace together in one song.*

*This is my prayer, O Lord of all earth's kingdoms,

Loving God

The Greatest Commandment says to love God with all your heart, mind, soul and strength. Likewise, the first two of the 10 Commandments tell us not to have any other Gods or idols that we put before God or that replace our love and honor of God. As disciples of Jesus we are to follow these commands. Easy, right? Well I think it is both the easy and hard. Easy when we're in worship, study or ministry. Easy when we get an answered prayer or witness God at work in our lives or the world. But harder day-to-day when worldly activity takes over and we tend to rely on our own wisdom and strength, and take too much personal credit for our blessings, joys and achievements. And although not intentional, we will often, if not regularly, put other things ahead of God, leave Him out, or forget about Him completely! I know this is not what we want to do, but it is what we do!

In last month's video I shared some ideas how to more consistently keep our love and honor for God front of mind by building better habits to make Him more present in our daily lives. Things like scheduled time to pray, or read and mediate in the Word; or by putting visible reminders in spaces and places that will bring our attention back to Him. All good, but bottom line, we need to get over ourselves! We need to take and give everything to God, not just our prayers but learning to immediately give Him thanks and praise for all things good in our lives, right when they happen. It's Him, not us, from whom all blessings flow. Learning to remember and acknowledge this truth will help us to more consistently turn our natural inward, self-centered focus outward and toward God, recognizing and admitting it's "How Great **Thou** Art", not how great *we* art!

6 Verses to Help You Rest This Summer

Hammock? Check. Lemonade? Check. A good book? Check. An afternoon all to yourself? Check.

Mix those four ingredients together and you have a recipe for a perfect summer afternoon. So why can't you relax? Why is your mind racing a mile a minute, as usual? What seems to be missing? There is one more secret ingredient needed for this dish and it is often overlooked - a spirit at peace.

For many of us, pushing the pause button is easier said than done, even during the summer months when life should slow down a little, giving us a chance to catch our breath and relax. But just as physical rest is necessary for a healthy body, spiritual rest is important for our spiritual well-being. And the **best way to rest your spirit is to rest in the One who created you.**



The notion of resting is a theme woven throughout Scripture beginning ... well, at the very beginning.

“On the seventh day God had finished His work of creation, so He rested from all His work.”

Genesis 2:2 NLT

Even God took a day to rest after creating the world and it's a lesson He intends for us to follow. Here are six verses you can focus on this summer – verses to remind you to rest in God and lean into Him so you can relax and fully enjoy the season.

“The Lord is my shepherd; I have all that I need. He lets me rest in green meadows; he leads me beside peaceful streams. He renews my strength.”

Psalms 23: 1-2 NLT

In God, we have all that we need. No matter what. He knows the “green meadows” and “peaceful streams” that will restore and renew each of us. And He promises to deliver. When we walk with Him, we can count on Him for complete rest and restoration.

“It is useless for you to work so hard from early morning until late at night, anxiously working for food to eat: for God gives rest to His loved ones.”

Psalms 127: 2 NLT

Even with the best of intentions, we can easily slip back

into the habit of counting on ourselves to meet our needs. We honor God with our work but not when it serves as a cover for our inability to trust in Him. Trusting in Him, while working and resting, is the key to renewal and refreshment.

“Therefore I say to you, do not worry about your life ... your heavenly Father knows that you need all these things. But seek first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be added to you.”

Matthew 6: 25-34 NKJV

In this passage, Jesus makes it clear that worrying about the future is a waste of time. Instead, He reminds us that our heavenly Father values us above all else and **He will care for us just as He does the flowers of the fields and the birds of the air.**

“Come to Me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.”

Matthew 11: 28-29 NIV

Responsibilities can be overwhelming but Jesus promises to help carry the load. And His shoulders are much bigger than ours! While He doesn't promise a life without hard work and trials, He does promise to be our partner, participating with us and walking with us every step of the way.

“Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all comprehension, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.”

Phil. 4: 6-7 NASB

In this passage, Paul provides some great advice – he suggests we turn our worries into prayers. When we stop worrying and start praying we will be filled with the complete peace and rest that only God can provide.

“I have told you these things so that, in Me, you may have peace. In this world, you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world.”

John 16:33 NIV

The next time a restless spirit threatens to ruin a perfect

summer day, stop and remind yourself that, in Jesus, the victory has already been won! God is in control, our destiny as believers is set, and things won't fall apart when we pause to enjoy the beauty of the world around us.

Looking for tools to help you rest in His arms this season? Maybe set some time aside to journal every morning to relax, meditate and focus on God and His Word. Ever thought of Bible journaling? Take time to soak in His presence before bed every night with a 30-minute unwind session using Bible journaling supplies. Also, be sure to send your loved ones summertime cards to remind them to praise God for his beautiful creation during these sure-to-be glorious summer months.

The Gift for the Person Who Has Everything

In our pocket of society where pampered affluence is rampant, we are often at a loss to know what kind of gifts to buy our friends and loved ones on special occasions. For some people (especially those who "have everything"), the standard gift won't cut it. Nothing in the shopping mall catches our fancy.

I have a suggestion. It may not seem that expensive or sound very novel, but believe me, it works every time. It's one of those gifts that has great value but no price tag. It can't be lost nor will it ever be forgotten. No problem with size, either. It fits all shapes, any age, and every personality. This ideal gift is . . . yourself. Don't forget the unusual value of kindness.

That's right, give some of yourself away:

- Give an hour of your time to someone who needs you.
- Give a note of encouragement to someone feeling down.
- Give a hug of affirmation to someone in your family.
- Give some time to someone who is lonely.
- Give a meal to someone who is sick.

-Give a word of compassion to someone who has suffered a loss.

-Give a second chance to the fallen.

-Give a deed of thoughtfulness to someone who is often overlooked.

-Give a gentle response to the frustrated.

In the words of Ephesians 4:32, be kind. My sister Luci paraphrases this verse, "Just be nice."

Covering all the one another commands of the Bible (and there's a lot of them!) is the umbrella of kindness. Kindness braids mercy and grace, humility and gentleness all together. Kindness gives grace, requires humility, and asks that we think of others before ourselves.

Ever notice that kindness is most appreciated when life has gone sideways? When you're having "one of those days," kindness speaks that thoughtful word and draws you back like a lifeline.

Who should the world look to as a model of kindness but the body of Christ? Unfortunately, ask the man on the street how he would describe the Christians he knows and I dare say kind would not be his first or even his second response. I say we change that.

Kindness is something you and I can do today. A gentle response. Being the first to forgive. Giving the gift of time, compassion, and thoughtfulness. In ordinary ways, we can give ourselves away and, by doing so, model God's agape love. Remember 1 Corinthians 13:4—"Love is kind."

Look for ways today to give ordinary kindness, and you'll find there's nothing ordinary about it.
