Hope Isn't Gone

"But God remembered Noah and all the wild animals and the livestock that were with him in the ark, and he sent a wind over the earth, and the waters receded." Genesis 8:1 (NIV)

The notification lit up my phone, alerting me that my biopsy results were in. My heart raced. Before I opened the message, a wave of uncertainty washed over me.

Storms often arrive without warning: a health diagnosis, a spouse's silence, a child's rebellion, a job loss, an unexpected news headline.

I've been there, too, waiting for something to heal, to steady my hope, to change. I've had seasons when my job felt unstable, my marriage felt fragile, and motherhood left me worn thin. The world felt heavy, and so did my heart. Quietly I prayed, God, please don't leave me in this.

Lately I've been thinking about Noah's waiting. God preserved him through a massive flood, but when the rain stopped, the earth was still underwater. It seems God gave no timeline or updates, just silence. Noah had obeyed God completely. Still, he drifted in the floodwaters, perhaps wondering if God had forgotten him.

Then we read: "But God remembered Noah and all the wild animals and the livestock that were with him in *the ark ...*" (Genesis 8:1).

In Scripture, when God remembers, it's not because He has previously forgotten. The Hebrew word zakar also means "to call to mind in order to act." It signals that God is about to move with compassion and purpose.

And God did in Genesis 8:1: "He sent a wind over the earth, and the waters receded." The ark came to rest. Then came signs of hope: A dove returned with a fresh olive leaf. Eventually, dry ground appeared. But God didn't stop there. He invited Noah, his family, and every animal out of the ark into a new beginning. He set a rainbow in the sky as a promise never to destroy the earth by flood again ... a reminder that His

> faithfulness never wavers. God didn't just shelter Noah from the storm; He preserved purpose in the middle of it and restored what was lost.

God's silence doesn't mean He's absent in our waiting. It's often the space where He's working, preparing, protecting, and making a way.

Today if you're feeling adrift and abandoned, still waiting and wondering what's next, anchor your hope to these three truths, friend:

God sees you. You aren't forgotten (Genesis 16:13).

God is working even when it's not apparent (Isaiah 64:4).

God equips you to wait well just like He did Noah (Genesis 6:14-16).

Sometimes the rain stops but the waters remain high

— healing and hope don't always arrive all at once. Yet in God's great love and unfailing compassion, the waters will subside, and hope will rise because God is a promise keeper.


My hope isn't in what I see. It's in the One who remembers me. And He remembers you too.

Dear God, thank You that Your remembrance means action. When I grow weary in the waiting, remind me that I'm not forgotten. I take comfort in knowing Your timing is perfect, and I rest in Your faithfulness. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

Christmas Customs

Have you ever wondered how and when some of our familiar Christmas customs developed? To answer this question I have adapted some of William J. Roehrenbeck's research for this article. For example, you can not find the word, "Christmas" in the Bible. Instead, the term "Christmas" was not used until the 11th century. In fact there is reason to believe that during the first three centuries of Christianity that many Christians were opposed to the pagan custom of celebrating birthdays at all. However, some Christians in Egypt were celebrating a feast commemorating the birth of Jesus Christ by the year A.D. 200. The Western Church after Emperor Constantine's acceptance of Christianity set December 25 as the date for the annual feast celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ. This feast became a day of adoration of Christ the Lord.

The earliest Christmas carols were first sung in Italy in the 13th century. O Come All Ye Faithful could be one of the earliest Christmas carols. The origin of God Rest You Merry Gentlemen has been assigned to the 16th century. Hark the Herald Angels Sing with its present musical score was first sung in the 19th century as was Silent Night.

The decoration and lighting of a Christmas tree was first observed in medieval German mystery plays. When the tree was set up in homes it was decorated with cookies, fruits, and eventually candles. German immigrants brought the concept of the home Christmas tree to the United States, but the custom of setting up and lighting Christmas trees in public places originated in the USA.

Christmas candles may have had their origin in the Jewish festival of the Rededication of the Second Temple (Hanukkah). In the Middle Ages it was customary to set up a candle in the center of a laurel wreath and keep it burning on Christmas Eve and every night during Advent. This may help to explain the origin of the advent wreath.

The nativity scene with a crib and a stable as a symbol of Christ's birth probably dates from St. Francis of Assisi in Italy on Christmas Eve in the year 1223. As far as gift-giving we know that medieval priests would open almsboxes and distribute the contents to the poor. Then it became customary to give Christmas "boxes" to servants and public workers. Later gifts were placed in homes

under Christmas trees or in stockings hanging from the mantle either on Christmas Eve or on Christmas Day.

The concept of the Christmas card was not introduced into the United States before 1875. Traditionally all over the world Christmas has been celebrated with special foods. In almost every nation special cakes, breads, and pastries are baked. Unfortunately Christmas Day, the commemoration of Jesus' birth, has become for many, only a family reunion with a Christmas dinner instead of a time of worship like we read about in Matthew 2:1-2. (KJV)

Now when Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judaea in the days of Herod the king, behold, there came wise men from the east to Jerusalem, Saying, Where is he that is born King of the Jews? for we have seen his star in the east, and are come to worship him.

I want to encourage you and your family this Advent season to come and make frequent and devoted worship of the Lord Jesus Christ the center of your Christmas activities and customs.
